Candle Blessings

Blessed are You Adonai our God, King of the universe, who sanctifies us with His mitzvot and commands us to light the candle of Shabbat.

Blessed are You Adonai our God, King of the universe, who sanctifies us with His mitzvot and cherishes us by granting us His holy Shabbat lovingly, gladly, a reminder of creation. It is the first among our holy days that recall the exodus from Egypt. Thus you have chosen us--endowing us with holiness--from among all peoples, granting us Your holy Shabbat, lovingly and gladly. Blessed are You Adonai who sanctifies Shabbat.
